If the hazards cannot be eliminated as close to where the problem is created as possible, reduce the risk of exposure to the hazard by:

### Engineering

Substitution Redesign of workplace Isolation/closed processes Automation/material handling devices Ventilation (general dilution/local exhaust) Purchasing criteria (tools/equipment etc. Storage Air monitoring

Or a **combination** of any of the three above

### Administrative

Policies/practices/procedures Work/rest schedules Limiting hours of work Scheduling/rotation of exposed workers Wet methods as opposed to dry sanding or sweeping Training Organizing and planning work
